**To bake:** Preheat oven to 425° F. (hot). Tear off top of foil pouch. Place frozen fish in its own foil pan on a cookie sheet and bake about 18 minutes.

## Recipe Exchange

A different way to use left-over vegetables is to serve them creamed over hot Johnny-cake squares which have been split and buttered. Three cups of a combination of vegetables (fresh, frozen or canned) to one cup of medium white sauce is a fair proportion. If the vegetables lack color, a Tb of parsley or a few pimientos will add that, and flavor, too.

### Johnny-cake

- 1/4 cup flour
- 3 t tartrate or
- 2 t combination baking powder
- 1 Tb sugar
- 1/2 t salt
- 1/2 cup cornmeal
- 1 egg
- 2 Tb melted shortening
- 1/2 cup milk

Put cornmeal in mixing bowl. Sift other dry ingredients over meal and mix well. In separate bowl beat egg, add melted shortening and then milk. Pour liquid into dry mixture and stir just enough to be blended. Pour into heated and buttered pan and bake at 425 degrees for about 25 minutes. A quarter teaspoon of nutmeg is often added to corn bread.
